### SnowCap's Youth Movement

It's no secret that SnowCap loves our volunteers. We value and appreciate every working or retired volunteer that has a few extra hours that they freely give to help others in their community.

And one of the best ways to keep that spirit of volunteerism going generation after generation, is by planting the seed early.

Recently, SnowCap has seen an influx of youth groups volunteering their time through their local Associated Student Body or National Honors Society chapters, and we couldn't be happier.

In January, ASB leaders from Gresham and Barlow High Schools helped organize a sock drive, collecting well over 500 pairs of new socks for SnowCap's clients.
