

Making Connections & Community

It was a busy day in the waiting room. One lady was complaining of electric shocks piercing her head through her eye. Another fellow asked if he could bring his pet pit bull indoors since it was raining outside. There was a very nervous Spanish-speaking mother and two children in the corner. A woman in an electric wheelchair was struggling to get in the front door. A middle-aged woman, clearly a first-timer looked about the room reading all the postings. A typical day with a lot going on.

Bilingual Diana was all smiles at the front counter as she checked eligibility through Linked 2 Feed (L2F), the Oregon Food Bank database that simplifies access to food banking services statewide. With L2F a thorough eligibility screening is done once a year. Throughout the year monthly visits can be made with speedy and simplified screenings. This system is a good balance between a detailed and time consuming eligibility determination at every visit and a rushed screening by well-intentioned volunteers that may never get the relevant information. Best of all this system is used by 57 different pantries in the metro area so we can accurately describe the demographics of who needs food and why. This is valuable information for both program design and advocacy.

The lady in the wheelchair wouldn't have been able to get in if the gentleman with the pit bull was not able to hold the door open for her.

The fearful Spanish speakers were reassured by Diana's fluent Spanish. The lady with the electric shocks was talked down from her hysteria and allowed to shop alone once we understood how nervous the crowd made her. The newcomer was welcomed and reassured.

Nothing dramatic, but everyone got what they needed. More importantly, it was given with great kindness and a calmness that brings everyone together. One by one they leave the waiting room for the pantry where the food is. This goes on until 2:00 when the door is locked and we can see that 97 families were served. More than the food, those 97 families were recognized as unique individuals, treated with respect and interest, and had the chance to visit with neighbors in a safe place. This is how we build community.
